

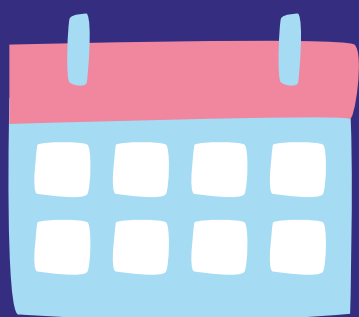

## ADAPTING YOUR FACE-TO-FACE LESSONS FOR EFFECTIVE REMOTE LEARNING

Keep our 5Cs front of mind!

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### CURRICULUM CONTENT

- Identify what curriculum content will be covered while students are learning remotely. Communicate this to students as clearly as possible. For example, email a table that summarises what your class will be learning each week while they are not at school.



### CLARITY

- Include process criteria or step-by-step instructions to help students understand the key steps they need to do to - one step at a time - to be successful.
- Be clear on what resources and how much time will be needed to complete each task.



### CHECK IN REGULARLY

- Maintain routines going as much as possible. Take the roll each lesson and check in with each student personally at least once a week if possible.
- Consider how you can check students' understanding regularly.



### CONNECTIONS

- Provide opportunities for students to work collaboratively whenever possible.
- Encourage students to make connections with what they are learning in their classroom and the real world, be it their home or community.



### CELEBRATE

- When students work together, have them reflect on what their group did well.
- Encourage students to reflect on and celebrate the effort they put into their learning.
