

# Remote Learning Pulse Check Survey

At Pivot we are dedicated to providing schools with support while they navigate the challenges presented by a shift to distance learning. We have devised a range of questions schools can use to conduct short surveys

## What is Pulse Check?

The Pivot Pulse Check tool enables teachers and school leaders to administer short focused surveys - up to 10 questions - at any point throughout the year. Pulse Checks can be turned around in real time giving educators fast, reliable data at their fingertips quickly. This ability to 'check in' allows individuals and teams the opportunity to make and monitor small changes in response to feedback during times of rapid structural - and pedagogical - change.

## What is the focus of the distance learning questions and who do they target?

Our questions are devised to gather feedback from teachers, students and families. They focus on readiness, capability and wellbeing when preparing for, and whilst undertaking, distance learning. Administered regularly these can provide leaders and teachers with valuable feedback about the shifting nature of education across their school community. Pivot's Remote Learning Pulse Check Survey items fall into the following categories:

## How do I conduct a Pulse Check?

1. Create a new Pulse Check survey by filling in the name, description, and date you created (or intend to administer) the survey.



2. Add 5 (or up to 10) questions, either creating your own or from our additional question bank.



3. Note the scaled response for any pre-loaded questions, or create your own with a free text response.



4. Publish and share your Pulse Check survey with your students, your teachers and your parent and guardians with our QR code or weblink.



5. Once you have a minimum of 5 respondents, you can close the survey and see/share your results.
